In recent years, the foundation, in collaboration with the Arlington Entertainment Area Management District, provided trolley transportation for AISD Dan Dipert Center students to participate in the hotel internship program at the Sheraton Arlington and Hilton Arlington. Thank you to our donors for your continued support of TSLF programs!

TSLF provides students with the tools and skills necessary for them to develop a career rather than just a series of jobs. Our services will allow young adults to become self-sufficient and upwardly mobile citizens to benefit not only themselves, but their families and our community as a whole.

TSLF is seeking to expand our programs so that we can assist more students in developing a career path in the Hospitality, Sports, and Travel and Leisure industry. One new program in development is the Pipeline Program. Work has already begun on collaboration with AISD to develop a system that can identify students at the junior high level who are interested in hospitality careers. TSLF believes that early identification of career goals coupled with proper assistance in developing their career paths will foster additional success.

TSLF was founded in October 2017; however, our mission was conceived following an Arlington CVB Board Meeting earlier that year. Later, conversations about how we might more effectively help youth develop a career rather than just a series of jobs led to the creation of TSLF programs we have today.

Although we have come a long way and are accomplishing our goals, there is much more to be done. Would you join us in this innovative program designed to give the students the skills they need to create prosperity?
